




PARTICIPATION IN DRAMA COMPETITION & QUIZ COMPETITION ON AIDS AWARENESS

Briefing Session of the Special Camp





Daily Activities during Special Camp

Day 1: Community Service through Education – Empowering young learners with knowledge and guidance, bridging the gap in rural education.

The Special Camp began with the active voluntary engagement of NSS volunteers in community-based teaching and awareness activities. As part of this initiative, the volunteers visited **836 No. Afar Lower Primary School, Dudhpatil**, where they interacted warmly with the students and conducted interactive sessions on essential life skills. They sensitized the children about personal hygiene, health practices, and the important concept of 'good touch and bad touch,' ensuring that the message was conveyed in a child-friendly and effective manner.

To further encourage creativity and participation, the volunteers organized an art competition, which received enthusiastic responses from the students. Prizes were distributed to the winners, bringing joy and motivation to the young participants. The program not only provided the students with valuable knowledge and memorable experiences but also offered the NSS volunteers an opportunity to connect with the rural community and witness the impact of their efforts firsthand.

This engagement at the grassroots level enabled the volunteers to develop a sense of social responsibility and realize the pivotal role they can play in fostering educational growth, spreading awareness, and contributing to the holistic development of society.



Day 2: Street Play for Voter Awareness – Engaging performances by NSS volunteers to inspire responsible citizenship and strengthen democratic participation.

On the second day of the Special Camp, NSS volunteers presented an engaging street play at the Community Centre of Masughat village. The performance creatively highlighted the significance of casting one's vote and emphasized the collective responsibility of citizens in sustaining an active and vibrant democracy. Conducted just ahead of the 2024 Lok Sabha elections, this innovative initiative served as an effective medium to spread voter awareness among the villagers. The impactful message of the play resonated strongly with the audience, encouraging them to exercise their democratic right responsibly.

Day 3: Spreading Warmth through Cloth Donation Drive – Extending a helping hand to the underprivileged by distributing clothes with compassion and care.

The NSS Cachar College, Silchar in association with NCC Cachar College, organized a clothing collection drive on the college campus from 6th to 12th February 2024. A total of 27 donors, comprising both teachers and students, contributed clothing items, which were carefully arranged and packed by the volunteers. The drive successfully collected over 300 items of clothing. In addition, Cachar College Employees' Thrift and Amenities Co-operative Ltd. extended their support by donating around 70 new clothing items to this noble initiative.

Subsequently, on the third day of the NSS Special Camp held on 6th March 2024, the collected clothing was distributed among the villagers of Masughat. Through this effort, 115 villagers benefitted from the cloth donation drive, reflecting the spirit of service and social responsibility upheld by the NSS Unit.

Day 4: Health & Wellness Awareness Survey – Conducting door-to-door interactions to promote hygiene, healthy practices, and community well-being.

On the 4th day of the special camp, NSS volunteers conducted door-to-door community survey at Masughat, the adopted village of Cachar College, Silchar. The primary objectives included comprehensive community assessment to understand the socio-economic profile, educational status, health conditions, and infrastructure availability in the village. A total of 39 families were surveyed and engaged in discussions regarding their socio-economic status, education, health, hygiene, availability of drinking water, infrastructure, and awareness of government schemes. The collected data was subsequently analyzed for further insights

The survey methodology aligned with NSS's participatory approach to rural development, ensuring that student volunteers gained direct exposure to village realities while simultaneously gathering data for evidence-based intervention planning. The baseline data collection objective ensures sustainable follow-up activities during subsequent NSS camps, creating a foundation for longitudinal community development initiatives.




Analysis of the data obtained from the survey

1. Demographics and Socio-Economic Profile

The survey revealed a balanced gender distribution with 20 male (51.3%) and 19 female (48.7%) respondents, reflecting relatively equitable participation across gender lines. The age distribution showed 38.5% of respondents in the 31-45 age group, 30.8% in the 18-30 category, 20.5% in the 46-60 range, and 10.3% above 60 years, indicating a predominantly working-age population. Marital status analysis revealed 71.8% married individuals, 15.4% unmarried, 10.3% widowed, and 2.6% divorced, typical of rural demographic patterns.

The educational profile presents both challenges and opportunities: while 79.5% of respondents have some level of education, 20.5% (8 individuals) remain completely uneducated. Educational distribution shows 30.8% with primary education, 28.2% with secondary education, 15.4% with higher secondary education, and only 5.1% with graduate-level education. This pattern reflects broader rural education challenges in Assam, where educational attainment decreases significantly at higher levels.


Employment patterns indicate 64.1% employment rate, with agriculture dominating the occupational landscape at 48% of all employed individuals. Daily labor constitutes 32% of employment, small businesses account for 12%, and government jobs represent only 8% of employment. This employment structure underscores the village's dependence on primary sector activities and informal labor markets, characteristic of rural economies across Assam.



2. Infrastructure and Basic Services Assessment

Water supply infrastructure analysis reveals mixed access patterns with 46.2% of households relying on public taps, 30.8% using hand pumps, 15.4% depending on wells, and 7.7% accessing other sources. This distribution indicates significant progress in rural water supply, likely reflecting the impact of government initiatives like the Jal Jeevan Mission. However, the continued reliance on traditional sources like wells and hand pumps suggests ongoing challenges in achieving universal piped water access.

Sanitation facilities show remarkable improvement with 82.1% of households having access to proper toilet facilities, while 17.9% still lack adequate sanitation infrastructure. This high coverage rate reflects the success of sanitation campaigns and schemes like Swachh Bharat Mission, though the remaining gap indicates need for continued focus on universal sanitation coverage. The household size distribution shows 56.4% of families have 4-6 members, 23.1% have 7 or more members, and 20.5% have 1-3 members, indicating predominance of nuclear to joint family structures.




3. Health and Healthcare Access Patterns

Healthcare accessibility presents significant geographical challenges with 71.8% of residents having healthcare facilities within 5 kilometers, while 28.2% must travel longer distances for basic medical services. Specifically, 51.3% access healthcare within 1-5 kilometers, 20.5% within 5-10

kilometers, and 7.7% must travel more than 10 kilometers. This distance barrier significantly impacts healthcare utilization, particularly for emergency services and regular check-ups.

Healthcare satisfaction levels reveal mixed experiences: 38.5% express satisfaction with available healthcare services, 46.2% report partial satisfaction, and 15.4% remain unsatisfied. This satisfaction pattern correlates with distance to facilities and availability of services, highlighting the need for improved healthcare infrastructure and service quality. Vaccination coverage reaches 64.1% of the population, indicating reasonable immunization penetration but suggesting room for improvement in preventive healthcare measures.

Disease awareness remains low with only 23.1% of respondents aware of diseases they might have, while 76.9% report no disease awareness. This low awareness could indicate either good health status or inadequate health screening and awareness programs, necessitating further investigation and targeted health education initiatives.




4. Education and Child Development

School enrollment patterns demonstrate encouraging progress with 82.4% of applicable children attending school, while 17.6% remain out of the educational system. This enrollment rate exceeds many rural averages in India, suggesting effective implementation of education policies and community awareness about educational importance. However, the 17.6% out-of-school rate


represents significant opportunity for intervention through targeted enrollment drives and addressing barriers to education access.

Educational satisfaction among parents shows 51.3% satisfaction with school education quality, 30.8% partial satisfaction, and 17.9% dissatisfaction. This satisfaction distribution indicates general appreciation for educational services while highlighting areas for quality improvement. The relatively high satisfaction rate reflects community investment in education and suggests receptiveness to educational development initiatives.



5. Government Scheme Awareness and Implementation Analysis

The survey evaluated government scheme penetration by measuring awareness levels and actual beneficiary participation across major welfare programs including Assam Orunodoi, PM Awas Yojana, Jal Jeevan Mission, Ayushman Bharat, and MGNREGA. Identifying development gaps between policy intentions and ground-level implementation formed another crucial objective, particularly focusing on the disparities between scheme awareness and actual benefit receipt. The data reveals significant variations in government scheme awareness across different programs. Assam Orunodoi Scheme demonstrates highest awareness at 89.7% (35 out of 39 respondents) with substantial beneficiary participation at 71.8% (28 beneficiaries). This high penetration reflects the scheme's targeted focus on women beneficiaries and effective state-level implementation through direct benefit transfer mechanisms



Conclusion

The NSS survey in Masughat village demonstrates the critical importance of systematic community assessment in understanding rural development dynamics and identifying intervention priorities. Student volunteer exposure to rural realities fulfills NSS's core educational objective of developing social consciousness and civic responsibility among youth. This direct community engagement creates future development leaders who understand grassroots challenges and can contribute to policy formulation and implementation throughout their careers. The survey process itself serves as community mobilization, raising awareness about available government schemes and encouraging greater participation in development programs.

The findings reveal a community with substantial development progress in basic infrastructure while facing persistent challenges in healthcare access and government scheme implementation effectiveness. The significant gaps between scheme awareness and beneficiary participation indicate systemic implementation challenges that require coordinated interventions involving government agencies, civil society organizations, and community leaders.

Future NSS camps should prioritize healthcare access improvement through mobile health clinics, telemedicine initiatives, and community health worker training programs to address the 28% of residents facing distance barriers to healthcare services. Government scheme awareness campaigns focusing on Ayushman Bharat and PM Awas Yojana implementation gaps could significantly improve benefit delivery to eligible populations.

Day 5: Water Quality Assessment at Masughat – Collecting and testing drinking water sources to ensure safe and sustainable access for the community.

On day five of the camp, NSS volunteers conducted a critical drinking water collection and water quality assessment initiative in Masughat village, demonstrating exemplary community service through scientific water sampling and laboratory testing. This initiative represents a paradigm of how student-led community service can generate vital public health data while simultaneously providing invaluable learning experiences for volunteers.

NSS volunteers executed a comprehensive sampling strategy covering five distinct water sources representative of the village's diverse water supply infrastructure: Ring Well, River, Pond Water, Tap Water, and Hand Pump.



The collected samples were analysed in **Sub-Divisional Level Laboratory**, **PHED**, **Silchar Division-II**, **Assam University Campus**. Each sample underwent comprehensive analysis for 17 different parameters including pH levels, Total Dissolved Solids (TDS), turbidity, iron content, chloride levels, total hardness, alkalinity, calcium, magnesium, fluoride, sulphate, arsenic, colour, odour, taste, residual chlorine, and bacterial contamination.

Analysis of Water testing report

The water quality analysis revealed that Tap water demonstrated the highest quality among tested sources with optimal pH (6.90), lowest turbidity (1.37 NTU), minimal iron content (0.16 mg/L), and acceptable dissolved solids (140 mg/L). River water also showed acceptable quality parameters with pH 6.54, moderate turbidity (2.25 NTU), and low iron content (0.37 mg/L), making it suitable for consumption after basic treatment. Traditional sources including Ring Well and Pond Water showed elevated turbidity levels above desirable limits but remained within permissible ranges for most parameters.

Turbidity emerged as a secondary concern across all sources, with levels ranging from 1.04 to 3.47 NTU, all exceeding the desirable limit of 1.0 NTU but remaining within the permissible limit of 5.0 NTU. Hand Pump water is critically contaminated with iron levels reaching 81.0 mg/L, representing 8,100% excess over the permissible limit of 1.0 mg/L.

The water testing results highlight the urgent need for proper filtration, particularly to address issues of turbidity and excessive iron contamination. While turbidity levels in most sources exceeded the desirable limit, they remained within the permissible range, indicating that simple household or community-level filtration systems could significantly improve water clarity and safety. However, the critically high iron concentration in hand pump water poses a severe health risk, making advanced treatment methods such as iron removal plants or deferrization units essential before consumption. Thus, effective filtration and treatment measures are vital to ensure safe, potable water and to safeguard the community from water-borne health hazards.

The NSS water quality testing initiative in Masughat village exemplifies exemplary community service that generates critical public health data while providing invaluable educational experiences for student volunteers.

Day 6: Cleanliness Drive for a Healthier Tomorrow – Mobilizing volunteers and community members to create cleaner and greener surroundings.

On the sixth day of the special NSS camp, the volunteers actively participated in a cleanliness drive organized along the riverside at Masughat. Equipped with cleaning tools, gloves, and bags, the volunteers enthusiastically engaged in removing plastic, litter, and other non-biodegradable waste that had accumulated along the riverbank. Their collective effort transformed the surroundings, making the area visibly cleaner and healthier for the community.

The activity encouraged the volunteers to adopt eco-friendly habits in their own lives and to raise awareness among others about the dangers of pollution. Moreover, it fostered team spirit, discipline, and social commitment among the youth. The experience reminded everyone that small actions, when carried out collectively, can bring about meaningful change in building a cleaner and greener future.



Day 7: Green Initiative through Plantation Drive – Planting trees to nurture the environment, combat climate change, and inspire ecological responsibility.

On the seventh day of the special NSS camp, the volunteers organized and carried out a plantation drive at the premises of Masughat Community Hall. With a strong sense of commitment towards environmental protection, the volunteers planted around seventy saplings of different species, carefully selected to suit the local climate and soil. Each sapling was planted with dedication, ensuring proper spacing and arrangement to promote healthy growth in the future. By engaging in this activity, the volunteers also spread awareness among the community about the importance of plantation and inspired others to join hands in preserving nature.

A total of 28 volunteers from the NSS Unit of Cachar College have successfully completed the mandatory requirement of 240 hours of voluntary service, along with participation in a Special Camp during their two-year tenure as NSS volunteers.
